

C- CLUB Descriptions

1. **Amnesty International:** This club works to ensure the human rights of individuals throughout the world. The club is affiliated internationally in a peaceful effort to make a difference, notably through letter-writing campaigns. In meeting, areas and people in crises are discussed.
2. **ASL:** This club will teach students the beginnings of American Sign Language that allow communication with hearing impaired individuals. Students will learn the alphabet, numbers, family members, and basic greetings.
3. **Ballroom Dancing:** This club is a group of students who convene once a week to learn techniques and steps of various partner dances. No prior experience or dance partner is needed for participation. The BRMHS Ballroom Dance Club teaches skills necessary for social and competitive dancing, as well as life and social skills.
4. **Chemistry:** The ACS certified Chemistry Club of BRMHS provides the opportunity for students to learn and engage in hands on demonstrations. Members are able to participate in numerous volunteering opportunities, while sharing their knowledge of chemistry with students and peers.
5. **Chinese Club:** This club is open to all students interested in learning Chinese culture. The club provides tutoring, service activities and social events for its members.
6. **Dr. Who:** This club helps the community as the Doctor would and to talk about and discuss Doctor Who.
7. **Electronics:** This club provides students a place to pursue their interest in Engineering by working on small projects with a focus on circuits, robotics, and programming. The club is open to students with and without experience in Engineering and robotics.
8. **FCA (Fellowship of Christian Athletes):** This club is where students and athletes come together to be a generation devoted to God and devoted to others. The club is open to all students, you don't have to be an athlete.
9. **Frisbee:** This club is open to all students who enjoy the activity of Frisbee. Students meet to plan games and competitions.
10. **Gaia Guild:** This club mobilizes youth by inspiring our peers to become environmentally conscious citizens and change the world through community service and education. Gaia members have the opportunity to work on BRMHS campus beautification and green initiatives.

11. **German Club:** This club is open to all students interested. Students can learn more about other cultures. The club provides tutoring service activities, social events, fundraisers, festivals and conventions for its members.
12. **Gourmet & International Culinary:** This club teaches students the basics in cooking as well as new and different culinary techniques. Exposes students to international foods and allows them to demonstrate their culinary skills through a media presentation.
13. **GSA:** Gay Straight Alliance Club is open to any student who supports a school where respect and dignity for all is the standard, working toward a heritage free of hate and unchallenged discrimination.
14. **Habitat for Humanity:** This club raises awareness of homeless, poverty and aid in the building of homes for those who cannot afford them. Members must be able to respect others' opinions and be able to work well as a team.
15. **International Culture Education and Travel (ICE-T):** This club is for any student interested in international travel in order to learn more about the culture of other nations and people. We meet to discuss the ins and outs of international travel, how to prepare for it, and what to expect. There are no membership dues.
16. **Interact Club** This club is affiliated with the Downtown Rotary Club. Membership is restricted to upperclassmen who can apply for membership each spring. Selection is based on grades and ability to meet service obligations and is currently limited to 32 students.
17. **Key Club:** *Key Club International* is the world's largest and oldest student-led service organization that is open to all students. Associated with Kiwanis International, members gain leadership skills and service opportunities by volunteering their time and resources. The club meets regularly for meetings, socials, and convention preparations. Membership dues and service hour minimums are required.
18. **Library Club:** This club is devoted exclusively to discussing books. Members choose the books to discuss, with the "talks" open to the entire school. Library Club members also have the opportunity to work in the BRMHS Library before and after school and both lunch shifts.
19. **Mu Alpha Theta:** This club is the National Mathematical Honor Society for high school and two-year colleges. Students must have a 3.0 unweighted average in math. The club participates in many math competitions

throughout the year including the State Convention and the National Convention.

20. **Spanish Club:** This club is open to all students interested in learning more about other cultures.
21. **Super Smash Brothers:** This club is to socialize with your fellow BRHS students as you play and win as your favorite character! This club has many Super Smash Brother tournaments and friendlies for you to win and play against your friends.
22. **Writers:** This club is open to all students. It provides activities and a sense of community for those with a passion for writing and love for literature.
